REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

GOSPEL: LUKE 4:21-30

**Jesus went straight through their midst
and walked away.**

At first the people were in seventh heaven. A great prophet was in their midst, and he was one of their own! It made them proud. But then Jesus accused them of vanity, and reminded them that prophets often had to take their gifts outside the community to be heard. Though true, these words enraged his listeners. In their anger, they turned murderous, as people who feel shamed often do. They would have killed him that very day if they had gotten their hands on him.

The funny thing is, they do not get their hands on him. The crowd rises up in the synagogue and runs him out of town, intending to force him off a cliff. Yet they are not able to do it, and Jesus just parts the crowd like the Red Sea and walks away. In Luke's view, Jesus wore God's protection like a shield. He never had to relinquish his life, and so his final surrender to the cross is all the more amazing. He let God choose the day and the hour; until then, he was obedient to God's power alone.

Questions for Reflection

What are the names of the gods that claim your attention? How do you resist them?

Choose one sentence from Paul's litany on love that describes your efforts to love. Which sentence describes how you need to grow in love?

When do you allow the voice of the mob to tamper with your obedience to God's will?

Action Response

Practice walking through the mob as Jesus did. When popular opinion demands that you think or act a certain way, disregard the group mentality and "just say no." Rediscover the freedom of being a citizen of another kingdom!
