REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S GOSPEL GOSPEL: LUKE 5:1-11

“Leave me, Lord, I am a sinful man.”

It was Peter's turn to “find himself” in the grand scheme of things. He had been a fisherman for as long as he could remember. He and his partners James and John had grown up by that lake, had been friends, and had lived in relative obscurity during that time. Then, unexpectedly, Jesus gets into his boat, and the rest is history: salvation history!

When Jesus gets into our boat, obscurity is no longer a possibility. Think about it: Peter, James, and John became Peter, James, and John. Three guys who fish became the privileged three friends of Jesus. A handful of frustrated fishermen became the most successful fellows on the lake. And not just because of that one day's catch.

Peter's response is the now-familiar pause of self-recognition: He is a sinner, not worthy of this honor. But Jesus tells him not to fear. It is to sinners that holiness comes, and in whom the Spirit of holiness chooses to dwell. Having ears to hear, these men leave the past behind and go with Jesus immediately.

Questions for Reflection

What is the main reason you resist the call to holiness in your life?

When did you most powerfully “see the Lord”? What did you learn about yourself in that encounter?

Imagine Jesus getting into your boat (your life) today. What about your present life-style would cause you fear or shame? How would you have to change?

Action Response

Begin a deeper surrender to holiness right now. Find the most beautiful thing you can think of and praise God for it. Stand in the presence of this wonder and invite the awe you feel to seek a home in you. Carry the spirit of reverence in you like a perpetual light.

LENT BEGINS WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2010

February 17, Ash Wednesday, is the first day of the 2010 Lenten season. The regulations pertaining to fast and abstinence are printed below, and are also accessible at [Lent](#) on the archdiocesan website www.archmil.org.

The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason:

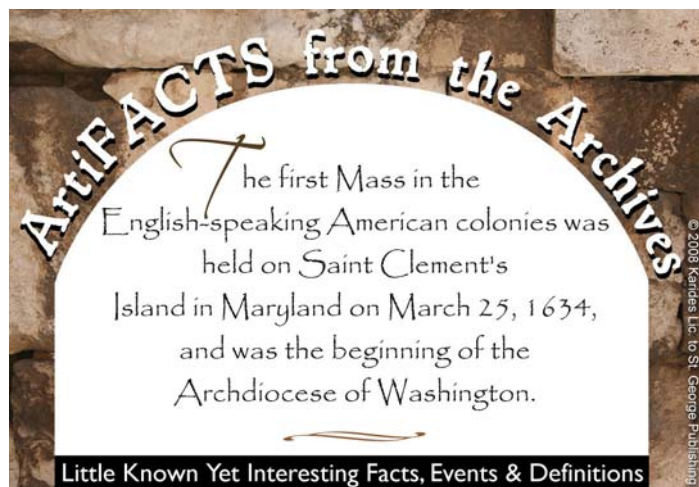
- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent;
- Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those two days.
- The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

Stations of the Cross: Thursdays during Lent at 6:30 p.m.
