Isaiah celebrates the new Jerusalem. Paul boasts of the cross of Jesus Christ. Here Jesus invites his disciples to celebrate the reign of God, and we know these three things speak to the same reality. It is like receiving three invitations to the same party.

Who were the seventy-two invited to the party? The number is chosen for its symbolic value to represent the whole world (seventy and seventy-two are numbers related to the “family of nations” in Genesis.) These seventy-two might have included your average parishioners today: some keen on their faith, some a little conservative in their involvement, some not regular in their attendance. All were sent, they went “everywhere”, and Satan fell from the sky like lightning.

Today we are the seventy-two, invited to go out there and cause Satan to collapse, witnessing against one evil at a time. God knows there are many to choose from. Find a friend, and get moving!

Questions for Reflection

Describe a time when someone was “Jerusalem” for you, lightening your burden and offering you comfort.

How has your faith invited you to die to the world in its goals and values?

Which two evils do you feel personally addressed to challenge in your family, parish, or greater community? How can you and a friend begin your testimony against them?

Action Response
